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1 Notes on this Manual

1.1 Scope of Validity

This manual is an integral part of X3-PRO G2 Series. It describes the assembly, installation, commissioning, maintenance and failure of the product. Please read it carefully before operating.

Note: "X3" means three phases. "PRO" means product series name. "8K" means rated output power is 8 kW. "G2" means this product is the second generation machine of the series. "2D" means two inputs of MPPT and with DC switch. "3D" means three inputs of MPPT and with DC switch. "LV" means the inveter works in 127 V a.c. /220 V a.c. low voltage range. Keep this manual at where it is accessible all the time.

1.2 Target Group

This manual is for qualified electricians. The tasks described in this manual only can be performed by qualified electricians.



2 Safety

2.1 Appropriate Usage

The series inverters are PV inverters which can convert DC power from PV generators to AC power and feed it into the public grid.



Surge protection devices (SPDs) for PV installation



Warning!

Over-voltage protection with surge arresters should be provided when the PV power system is installed.

The grid connected inverter is fitted with SPDs in both PV input side and MAINS side.

Lightning will cause a damage either from a direct strike or from surges due to a nearby strike.

Induced surges are the more likely cause of lightning damage in majority of installations, especially in rural areas where electricity is usually provided by long overhead lines. Surges may be induced on both the PV array conductors or the AC cables leading to the building.

Specialists in lightning protection should be consulted in the actual application. Using appropriate external lightning protection, the effect of a direct lightning strike into a building can be mitigated in a controlled way, and the lightning current can be discharged into the ground.

Installation of SPDs to protect the inverter against mechanical damage and excessive stress include a surge arrester in case of a building with external lightning protection system (LPS) when separation distance is kept.

To protect the DC system, Surge Protection Device(SPD type2) should be fitted at the inverter end of the DC cabling and at the array located between the inverter and the PV generator, if the voltage protection level (VP) of the surge arresters is greater than 1100V, an additional SPD type 3 required surge protection for electrical devices.

To protect the AC system, surge protection devices (SPD type2) should be fitted at the main incoming point of AC supply (at the consumer's cutout), located between the inverter and the meter/distribution system; SPD (test impulse D1) for signal line according to EN 61632-1.

All DC cables should be installed to provide as short a run as possible, positive and negative cables of the string or main DC supply should be bundled together. Avoiding the creation of loops in the system. This requirement for short runs and bundling includes any associated earth bundling conductors.

Spark gap devices are not suitable to be used in DC circuits once conducting, they won't stop conducting until the voltage across their terminals is typically more than 30 volts.

► Anti-Islanding Effect

Islanding effect is a special phenomenon that grid-connected PV system still supplies power to the nearby grid when the grid loss happened in the power system. It is dangerous for maintenance personnel and the public. The series inverters provide Active Frequency Drift(AFD) to prevent islanding effect.

2.2 Important Safety Instructions

Danger!

- •The appliance is not to be used by children or persons with reduced physical sensory or mental capabilities, or lack of experience and knowledge, unless they have been given supervision or instruction.



•Comply with the local requirements for grounding the PV modules and the PV generator. It is recommended to connect the generator frame and other electrically conductive surfaces in a manner which ensures continuous conduction and ground these in order to have optimal protection of system and persons.



Warning!

•Ensure input DC voltage ≤Max. DC voltage. Over voltage may cause permanent damage to inverter or other losses, which will not be included in warranty!



Warning!

•Authorized service personnel must disconnect both AC and DC power from the inverter before attempting any maintenance or cleaning or working on any circuits connected to the inverter.



Warning!

Do not operate the inverter when the device is running.



Warning!

Risk of electric shock!

- Prior to the application, please read this section carefully to ensure correct and safe application. Please keep the user manual properly.
- Use only attachments recommended. Otherwise may result in a risk of fire, electric shock, or injury to person.
- Make sure that existing wiring is in good condition and that wire is not undersized.
- Do not disassemble any parts of inverter which are not mentioned in installation guide. It contains no user-serviceable parts. See Warranty for instructions on obtaining service. Attempting to service the inverter yourself may result in a risk of electric shock or fire and will void your warranty. Keep away from flammable, explosive materials to avoid fire disaster.
- The installation place should be away from humid or corrosive substance.
- Authorized service personnel must use insulated tools when installing or working with this equipment.
- PV modules shall have an IEC 61730 class A rating.
- Never touch either the positive or negative pole of PV connecting device. Strictly prohibit touching both of them at the same time.
- The unit contains capacitors that remain charged to a potentially lethal voltage after the MAINS and PV supply have been disconnected.
- Hazardous voltage will present for up to 5 minutes after disconnection from power supply.
- CAUTION RISK of electric shock from energy stored in capacitor. Never operate on the solar inverter couplers, The MAINS cables, PV cables or the
- PV generator when power is applied. After switching off the PV and Mains, always wait for 5 minutes to let the intermediate circuit capacitors discharge before you unplug DC and MAINS couplers.
- When accessing the internal circuit of solar inverter, it is very important to wait 5 minutes before operating the power circuit or demounting the electrolyte capacitors inside the device. Do not open the device before hand since the capacitors require time to sufficiently discharge!
- Measure the voltage between terminals UDC+ and UDC- with a multi-meter (impedance at least 1 Mohm) to ensure that the device is discharged before beginning work (35 VDC) inside the device.

PE Connection and Leakage Current

- All inverters incorporate a certified internal Residual Current Device(RCD) in order to protect against possible electrocution and fire hazard in case of a malfunction in the PV array, cables or inverter. There are 2 trip thresholds for the RCD as required for certification (IEC 62109-2:2011). The default value for electrocution protection is 30 mA, and for slow rising current is 300 mA.
- If an external RCD is required by local regulations, it is recommended to choose a Type-A RCD with the rating residual current of 300 mA.



Warning!

High leakage current! Earth connection essential before connecting supply.

- Incorrect grounding can cause physical injury, death or equipment malfunction and increase electromagnetic.
- Make sure that grounding conductor is adequately sized as required by safety regulations.
- Do not connect the ground terminals of the unit in series in case of a multiple installation. This product can cause current with a d.c. component. Where a residual current operated protective (RCD) or monitoring (RCM) device is used for protection in case of direct or indirect contact, only an RCD or RCM is allowed on the supply side of this product.

For United Kingdom

- The installation that connects the equipment to the supply terminals shall comply with the requirements of BS 7671.
- Electrical installation of PV system shall comply with requirements of BS 7671 and IEC 60364-7-712.
- · No protection settings can be altered.
- User shall ensure that equipment is so installed, designed and operated to maintain at all times compliance with the requirements of ESQCR22(1)(a).

2.4 EC Directives







5.1 Check for Transport Damage

Make sure the inverter is intact during transportation. If there are some visible damages, such as cracks, please contact your dealer immediately.

5.3 Installation Precaution

The series inverter is designed for outdoor installation (IP66).

Make sure the installation site meets the following conditions:

- · Not in direct sunlight.
- Not in areas where highly flammable materials are stored.
- · Not in potential explosive areas.
- · Not near the television antenna or antenna cable.
- · Not higher than altitude of about 4000 m above sea level.
- · Not in environment of precipitation or humidity.
- Be sure the ventilation is good enough.
- The ambient temperature in the range of -30 $^{\circ}$ C to +60 $^{\circ}$ C.
- The slope of the wall should be within ±5°.
- The wall hanging the inverter should meet conditions below:
- 1. solid brick/concrete, or strength equivalent mounting surface;
- 2. Inverter must be supported or strengthened if the wall's strength isn't enough(such as wooden wall, the wall covered by thick layer of decoration)

Please avoide direct sunlight, rain exposure, snow laying up during installing and operating.

6 Electrical Connections

6.1 PV Connection

The series inverter have three couples of PV connectors which can be connected in series into at most 3-inputs of PV modules. Please select photovoltaic modules with good performance and quality assurance. The open circuit voltage of the module array should be less than the maximum PV input voltage specified by the inverter, and the operating voltage should be within the MPPT voltage range.




Step 2. Use a wire stripper to strip 7 mm insulation layer from the wire end.






Step 4. Tighten the PV pin contact and the wiring harness to make the connection tight without looseness.




Step 5. Divide the PV terminal into 2 parts - the plug and the fastening head. Insert the cable through the fastening head and the corresponding plug. Note that the red and black lines correspond to different plugs. Finally, force the cable pair into the plug, there will be a "click" sound, which indicates that the connection is completed.




Step 6. Tighten the fastening head and insert into the corresponding positive and negative (PV+/PV-) ports of the inverter.






Incorrect Connection between Loads and Inverter



Selection of Fuses and Cables

Mains cable (AC line cable) shall be short-circuit protected and thermal overload protected.

Always fit the input cable with fuse. Normal gG (US:CC or T) fuses will protect the input cable in short circuit situation. They will also prevent damage to adjoining equipment.

Dimension the fuses according to local safety regulations, appropriate input voltage and the related current of the solar inverter.

The rated short-circuit breaking capacity of the above protective device shall be at least equal to the prospective fault current at the point of installation. See section technical data of this manual for details.

2. Fuses must be approved by Notified Body.

Therefore the current-carrying capacity of the components and sub-assemblies provided in the end-use system (connectors, cables, junction box, switchgear, etc.) and the reverse current PV modules shall be considered based on the feedback current and reverse current. The direct current (DC) circuit breaker or fuse between each solar generator and inverter shall be provided based on solar inverter input ratings.



6.3 Earth Connection



b) Strip 7 mm insulation layer from the end and pull the terminal sleeve over the cable.






6.4 Communication Connection

This product has a series of communication interfaces: such as WiFi/LAN/GPRS, RS485/Meter, DRM and USB for upgrading for human and machine communication. Operating information like output voltage, current, frequency, faulty information, etc., can be delivered to PC or other monitoring equipment via these interfaces.

6.4.1 Monitoring Connection (Optional)

This inverter provides a monitoring dongle connecting port (the Dongle port) which can collect information from inverter including status, performance and updating information to the monitoring website via connecting WiFi/LAN/4G dongle (The monitoring dongle is optional, which can be purchased from the supplier if needed).

For example, insert the WiFi dongle into the port named "Dongle" on the bottom of the inverter.



6.4.2 COM Connection

This inverter provides a COM port, through this port the inverter can achieve multiple functions like DRM(Demand Response Management), dry contact function and heat pump control via Adapter Box.



- b) Prepare RJ45 connector and a communication cable.
- c) Strip the insulation from the communication cable.






6.4.3 RS485/Meter Connection

There is an RS485 port on the bottom of the inverter. Through this port, the inverter can communicate with the computer, Datahub or other devices and the meter and achieve the parallel function or EV-Charger function.







6.4.3.1 Meter Connection (Optional)

The inverter can communicate with a meter through this interface, with the meter you can:

- 1. Monitor the energy to grid and from grid throughout the whole day.
- 2. Achieve the export control function with a higher accuracy.

The smart meter must be authorized by us, any third party or non-authorized meter may not match with the inverter. We will not take the responsibility if the unauthorized meter is unavailable.

6.4.3.2 Parallel Connection

The series inverter provides the parallel connection function, which could support several inverters to parallel in one system and can control zero injection to the grid with a meter installed in the main circuit.

The parallel system can be achieved with Modbus Function or with Datahub. Please refer to the following diagrams.

Diagram A: Parallel system with Modbus Function





Diagram B: Parallel system with Datahub

Before operation, please make sure that the inverters meet the following conditions:

- 1. All the inverters are recommended to be the same series;
- 2. The firmware version of all inverters shall be the same. Otherwise, the parallel function cannot be used.

Parallel system with Modbus Function

In this parallel system, at most 5 inverters can be connected. One inverter will be set as a master, and the rest are the slaves. The master inverter can communicate with all the slave inverters.

Wiring operation

- a) Connect all the inverters in the parallel system with each other via RS485
- b) Connect the communication cable of the meter with the master inverter.

LCD setting

Turn on the power of the entire system, enter the "Settings" page of the inverters on the LCD screen. Follow the instructions below to complete the settings.

a) Make sure the meter is connected to the master inverter. Enter the "Export Control" page and choose "Meter" on the master inverter.

b) Enter "ParallelSetting" page, choose "Enable" to activate the function for all the inverters. Please disable this function if not needed.

d) Set the value for "System Limit" on the master inverter. This will be the overall power limit for the parallel system. The output power of slaves will then be distributed respectively according to their nominal output power. The value can be set within the range of 0 kW to 180 kW and the default value is 180000 W.

The power limit value set in "System Limit" is the limit for the multiple inverters in the parallel system, while the "UserValue" set in "Export Control" is the power limit for a single inverter which will be nullified when the parallel function is enabled.

Note!

The parallel system with Modbus Function and the EV-Charger function cannot be used at the same time currently. If the EV-Charger is connected when multiple inverters are working in the parallel system:



When the "ParallelSetting" is enabled, the EV-Charger will become a common load and can only charge in Fast mode, other smart charging modes will not be available.

When the "ParallelSetting" is disabled, the EV-Charger function is enabled, then the EV-Charger can work normally with the inverter it is connected to, while other inverters cannot realize the export control function.

Parallel system with Datahub

In this parallel system, at most 60 inverters can be connected. The Datahub will be the master of the system, and all the inverters are the slaves. The Datahub can communicate with all the slave inverters.

Note!

Before connecting the Datahub to the parallel system, please check that the inverters' settings meet the following conditions:



- 1. The "Modbus Fuction" should be "COM485".
- 2. The "ParallelSetting" should be "Disable".
- 3. The addresses of all the inverters in the "RS485 CommAddr" should be **different**. Otherwise, please reset the RS485 communication addresses.

The inverter connected with the Datahub should not enable the "Parallel Setting".


There is no need to set the "ParallelSetting" on the inverters, the parallel system with Datahub will start automatically.

6.4.3.3 EV-Charger Function

The inverter can communicate with the smart EV-Charger to form an intelligent photovoltaic, storage and EV charging energy system, thus maximizing the utilization of photovoltaic energy.

Diagram: Intelligent Photovoltaic, Storage and EV Charging Energy System



Wiring operation

a) Plug one end of the communication cable to the right pin of the EV-Charger and the other end to PIN 1 & 2 or 3 & 4 of the "RS485" port of the series inverter. b) Connect the meter to PIN 5 & 6 of the "RS485" port of the inverter.

LCD setting

Turn on the power of the entire system, enter the "Settings" page of the inverters on the LCD screen.

a) Enter the "Export Control" page and choose "Meter".

b) Enter "Modbus Fuction" and select "EV Charger".

c) Set the "Grid Data Source" as "Inverter" in the APP of the EV-Charger.

Note!

The EV-Charger function and the parallel system with Datahub or the parallel system with Modbus Function cannot be used at the same time currently.

6.4.3.4 Special Notice

The three functions (i.e. Parallel system with Modbus Function, Parallel system with Datahub and EV-Charger function) conflict with each other due to sharing the same RS485 port and only one of the three functions can be used at a time.

If the three functions are enabled at the same time accidentally, please follow the instructions below:

- 1. If the "ParallelSetting" is enabled and the inverter is the master one while the system is connected with Datahub, please remove the Datahub then the parallel system will work normally. If the Datahub is to be remained in the parallel system, remove the Datahub first and disable the "ParallelSetting", then reconnect the Datahub.
- 2. The parallel system and the EV-Charger function cannot be enabled at the same time. Once the EV-Charger function is enabled, remove the external RS485 wiring or connect it to the EV-Charger if the external RS485 is connected with another inverter.
- 3. If the EV-Charger function is enabled and Datahub is connected in the system, please remove the Datahub, then the EV-Charger will work normally. If the Datahub is to be remained in the parallel system, remove the Datahub first and change "EV Charger" to "COM485" under the "Modbus Fuction", then reconnect the Datahub.

6.4.4 Upgrade

The inverter system can be updated through an U-disk.



Warning!

Make sure the input voltage is more than **200 V** (in good illumination condition), or it may result in failing during updating.

Upgrade Steps:

1) Please contact our service support to get the update file, and extract it into your U-disk as the following file path:





2) Make sure the DC switch is off and the AC is disconnected with grid. If the WiFi dongle is connected to the port, please remove the WiFi dongle at first.



3) Then insert the U-disk into the Dongle port on the bottom of the inverter. Then turn on DC switch and connect the PV connector, the LCD will show a picture as below.



- 4) Press the "Up" and "Down" button to select ARM or DSP. Then long press "Down" and select the correct update file to confirm the update. ARM and DSP shall be updated one by one.
- 5) After the upgrade is completed, please remember to turn off the DC switch or disconnect the PV connector, then pull off the U-disk, and connect the WiFi dongle back.





During updating, don't turn off the DC switch or disconnect the PV connector. If the updating stopped due to PV power failure, do not unplug the U-disk. When the PV power recovers, the update will continue. If the updating stopped due to other reasons, reinsert the U-disk to continue the update.

6.5 Run the inverter

Start inverter after checking all below steps:

- a) Check that device is fixed well on the wall.
- b) Make sure all the DC breakers and AC breakers are OFF.
- c) AC cable is connected to grid correctly.
- d) All PV panels are connected to inverter correctly, DC connectors which are not used should be sealed with a lid.

Start inverter

- •Turn on the external AC and DC switches.
- •Turn on the DC switch to the "ON" position.
- Inverter will start automatically when PV panels generate enough energy.
- Check the status of LED indicators and LCD screen, the LED indicators should be blue and the LCD screen should display the main interface.
- If the LED indicator is not blue, please check the below:
- All the connections are correct.
- All the external disconnect switches are closed.
- The DC switch of the inverter is in the "ON" position.

Below is the three different states when operating, which means inverter starting up successfully.

Waiting: Inverter is waiting to checking when DC input voltage from panels is greater than $160\,V$ (lowest start-up voltage) but less than $200\,V$ (lowest operating voltage).

Checking: Inverter will check DC input environment automatically when DC input voltage from the PV panels exceeds 200 V and PV panels have enough energy to start inverter.

Normal: Inverter begins to operate normally with blue light on, meanwhile the inverter feeds back energy to the grid and the LCD displays current output power. Enter the setting interface to follow the instructions when it is first time to start up.



Warning!

Power to the unit must be turned on only after installation work has been completed. All electrical connections must be carried out by qualified personnel in accordance with legislation in force in the country concerned.



b) Export Control

With this function the inverter can control energy exported to the grid. Whether having this function is based on user's wishes.

Choose "Meter" in "Meter/Disable" means user must install a meter to monitor energy exported to the grid. There are user value and factory value. The factory value is default which can not be changed by user. The user value set by installer must be less than the factory value and within the range of 0 kW to 30 kW.



This section will help you narrow down the source of any problems you may encounter. Please read the following troubleshooting steps.

Check warnings or fault messages on System Control Panel or Fault codes on the inverter information panel. If a message is displayed, record it before doing anything further.

- If the information panel of your inverter does not show the Fault light, check the following list to make sure that the present state of the installation allows proper operation of the unit.
 - Is the inverter located in a clean, dry, adequately ventilated place?
 - Have the DC input breakers been opened?
 - Are the specification and length of the cables suitable?
 - Are the input and output connections and wiring in good condition?
 - Are the configuration settings correct for your particular installation?
 - Are the display panel and the communications cable properly connected and undamaged?

Contact our Customer Service for further assistance. Please be prepared to describe details of your system installation and provide model and serial number of the unit.

8.2 Routine Maintenance

Regular safety check and maintenance are required.

► Safety checks

Safety checks should be performed at least every 12 months by manufacturer's qualified person who has adequate training, knowledge, and practical experience to perform these tests. The data should be recorded in an equipment log. If the device is not functioning properly or fails any of test, the device has to be repaired. For safety check details, refer to this manual, section 2 Safety instruction and EC Directives.

► Maintain periodically

Only qualified personnel may perform the following works.

During the process of using the inverter, the manage person shall examine and maintain the machine regularly. The concrete operations are as follows.

- 1: Check that if the cooling fins on the rear of the inverter are covered by dirt, and the machine should be cleaned and absorbed dust when necessary. This work shall be performed from time to time.
- 2: Check that if the indicators of the inverter are in normal state, check if the keys of the inverter are in normal state, check if the display of the inverter is normal. This check should be performed at least every 6 months.
- 3: Check that if the input and output wires are damaged or aged. This check should be performed at least every 6 months.
- 4: Clean the inverter panels and check their security. This should be carried out at least every 6 months.

Decommissioning Disclaimer

9 Decommissioning

9.1 Dismantling the Inverter

- · Disconnect the inverter from DC Input and AC output.
- · Wait for at least 5 minutes for de-energizing.
- · Disconnect communication and optional connection wirings.
- · Remove the inverter from the bracket.
- · Remove the bracket if necessary.

9.2 Packaging

If possible, please pack the inverter with the original packaging. If it is no longer available, you can also use an equivalent carton that meets the following requirements.

- ·Suitable for loads more than 30 kg.
- ·With handle.
- ·Can be fully closed.

9.3 Storage and Transportation

Store the inverter in dry place where ambient temperatures are always between -30°C - $+60^{\circ}\text{C}$. Take care of the inverter during the storage and transportation, keep less than 4 cartons in one stack.

9.4 Waste Disposal

When the inverter or other related components need to be disposed, have it carried out according to local waste handling regulations. Please be sure to deliver wasted inverters and packing materials to certain site where can assist relevant department to dispose and recycle.
